TENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (C)

The readings of today's Mass teach us that God always brings something out of nothing. At times of total despair, when all hope seems lost, God has the power to change our hearts and revive us. No matter where we find ourselves, or how desperate our circumstances, God can heal us, and bring forth confidence and new life.

The first reading (1 Kings 17: 17-24) and Gospel (Luke 7: 11-17) both speak about widows who have lost their only sons. The widow in the first reading was visited by the Prophet Elijah at a time of famine. During his visit, her son falls gravely ill and dies. The mother becomes angry with God, but Elijah takes the boy and pleads with the Lord to heal and revive him. The Lord heard the prayer and the child comes back to life. As a result, the woman's faith was restored.

Similarly in the Gospel, Jesus enters the town of Nain, where He and disciples see a funeral procession taking place. Another widow is mourning the loss of her only son. Jesus feels sorry for her and intervenes. 'Do not cry,' He says, and putting out His hand, commands her son to get up. He gets up and begins to walk, and like the woman in the first reading, the crowds all around are strengthened in faith and proclaim, 'God has visited His people.'

In both these events, a period of darkness is followed by a turning point. Through Elijah, and directly in the person of Jesus, God injects His grace into situations of despair, bringing hope and reviving faith.

As Paul recounts in his letter to the Galatians (1: 11-19), he once fiercely persecuted the Church. Saul – as he was then known – was as far from being a Christian as one could be. And yet on the road to Damascus, he encountered the risen Lord, and Saul became Paul, the great teacher of the faith.

In all the readings today, God injects grace into someone's life, and he can always do the same for us if we are open to Him. If we get trapped in sin or difficulties, and feel we have no way out, this is precisely the time to turn to the Lord, to seek His forgiveness in trust. This may take time and great patience, for healing to take place. But never give up – even from rock bottom; cry out to the Lord for His grace, for we have a God who can create wonders from nothing.
