FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Today is the feast of the Presentation of Jesus. Mary and Joseph take the child Jesus to the temple and present Him to the priest. According to the Law of Moses in the Old Testament, all firstborn males were to be consecrated to the Lord. Women who had given birth were considered unclean and were required to go to the temple after 40 days and offer sacrifice in order to be purified. Today is the 40th day after Christmas, and so we commemorate Our Lady's purification, as well as the Presentation of the Lord.

In fact, Mary had no need of this purification, as she was without sin. But she observed God's will as expressed through the Law of Moses, and was obedient to it. Her obedience showed her purity of heart.

The coming of Jesus into the temple is very significant. The temple of Jerusalem was the place of worship, where man came to encounter God. The Child Jesus, in His vulnerability, enters the temple to meet broken humanity. Thus Malachi's prophecy in the First Reading is fulfilled, that 'the Lord you are seeking will suddenly enter His temple.' There, Jesus is met by Simeon and Anna, two people of faith, who had been waiting in expectation, seeking the Lord.

Simeon calls the child, 'a light to enlighten the pagans'. On today's feast we recall that we have received the light of Christ. To walk in that light means to be at peace and harmony with God and with our neighbor. But we all know that in each of our lives there are areas of darkness and shadow. We need to be purified constantly. We know that we can always come to Christ for forgiveness when we have sinned. But Christ not only forgives our sins, He wants to transform us. He seeks to refine us, in the way that fire refines silver and gold, melting out the impurities.

We often make excuses to avoid facing the impurities in ourselves, or may even deny they exist. We need the fire of the Holy Spirit to show us the areas in need of purification, and move us towards Christ, who came to purify us.

When our hearts are pure we radiate His light more clearly. We pray that the light may increase in us, so that we may more effectively bear it to others.
