SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT (A)

Today's Gospel is the account of the Transfiguration. Jesus is on the way to Jerusalem where He will offer Himself on the cross for us, but here He takes Peter, James, and John with Him up a high mountain, and they see Him transformed, appearing in glory. They realise now that there is more to Jesus than meets the eye. They get a glimpse of who He really is, of His divinity.

Like the disciples, there are times when we too get glimpses of the presence of God in our lives, like when we receive love from others or when we see someone making a sacrifice for another. We can glimpse God in the beauty of a fine day, or at moments of wonder, like the birth of a child. Of course, there are also times during prayer when we feel great, we experience consolation and feel that God is with us, as the disciples did. This can give us confidence and strength in later times of trouble. Indeed, one of the reasons Jesus was transfigured was to give the disciples courage to face the difficulties ahead. It would be a moment for them to look back to with gratitude after the crucifixion, when facing persecution themselves. The transfiguration was to help them look beyond the present moment to the glory that Christ promises them. Peter wanted to hold onto this, 'it is good for us to be here', he says, but Jesus Himself leads them down the mountain. Jesus must face the agony of the cross before He can achieve glory. It is the same for all of us who follow Christ – we have to carry our crosses with Him. There is no shortcut to glory.

Though we may have moments of consolation in prayer, we should not be surprised if we feel nothing most of the time. We should not get discouraged, but should stay faithful – prayer can be at its most powerful when we don't find it easy, so don't be tempted to give up – stay with it. In letters published after her death, Mother Teresa said she did not have any consolation of 'good feelings' in prayer for many decades, yet she remained faithful to it.

St Paul advises us to 'bear our share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God.' In the course of this week we will undoubtedly experience some hardship, whether big or small, especially if we are faithful to our Lenten resolution. Let us remember that whatever cross we have to bear, God gives us the strength to carry it.

For a little while, in this life, we are under a kind of dark cloud, with just moments when the sun breaks through. But the Transfiguration teaches us to persevere, striving onwards for future glory.
