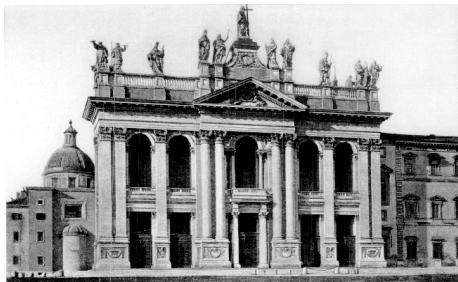

DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA



We celebrate today the Dedication of the Basilica of St John Lateran in Rome. The Basilica is a large Church in Rome, which is the Pope's Cathedral – that is where his chair as bishop of Rome is. On the façade of the building there is an inscription in Latin, which reads 'the mother and head of all the churches of Rome and the world.' Those of us who have been to Rome might think St Peter's Basilica is the head of all the churches, but it is actually St John Lateran, because historically, the Popes lived next to this basilica and only moved later to the Vatican area. It is dedicated to St John the Baptist – but the name 'Lateran' comes from the family who owned the land upon which the structure is built.

So why are we celebrating this particular Church building? First of all, it shows our unity with the Holy Father. He is the sign of unity for the universal Church, and in communion with him, we are united to the Church throughout the world. But there is more to the feast. The readings today speak about the Temple of Jerusalem, the place where God was worshipped. The Ark of the Covenant was kept there, a golden chest containing the Ten Commandments, the staff of Aaron and pieces of the manna from heaven. God was believed to dwell there. The temple was destroyed by the Babylonians in 586BC, and Ezekiel's prophecy from the First Reading looks forward to a new temple, from which water would flow, that would be life-giving and healing.

By the time of Jesus, the Jerusalem Temple had been rebuilt, but in today's Gospel, Jesus cleanses it, driving out the moneychangers and traders. The people had ceased to regard the building as sacred, and they were using it for their own ends. Jesus shows His authority in driving them out, and points to Himself as the new Temple. In the Jerusalem Temple, the Jews sacrificed animals, according to the Law, to atone for sin. But now Jesus is the definitive sacrifice to atone for the sins of the world – and so He replaces the function of the temple. God dwells within Him because He is God. And as Ezekiel prophesied water flowing from the Temple to give life, we recall how water, along with blood flowed from the side of Christ.

This life-giving water recalls the water of baptism, in which we are born into the life of God – and the blood evokes the Eucharist, which is given to sustain us. Every Church is built for the celebration of the Mass, in which Christ's sacrifice on Calvary is made truly present – and the other Sacraments. Every Catholic Church is a new Temple, because God dwells with us here, and we draw strength and healing from Him. The Tabernacle is the new Ark of the Covenant, because it contains the True Presence of Jesus Christ: Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.

By extension, when we receive the sacraments and are in the state of grace, we have the life of God within us, and in that sense, we too are temples of the Holy Spirit. As St Paul said, 'Didn't you realise that you are God's temple, and that the Spirit of God is living among you?'

So this feast teaches us respect for holy places – for the Church, universal and local – and respect for one another, inasmuch as we are also dwelling places for God.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: The next session for the First Communion programme is on 22nd November at 10am in the parish Hall.
