## **THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT (B)**

Today's first reading details the Ten Commandments. The first three speak of God, and the remaining seven of our relationships with one another. To worship God means that other things, like celebrities, money, possessions, sex and flashy cars are not number one in our lives, but God comes first.

If God comes first, we want to please Him, which means we treat His name with respect. It also means that we keep holy the Sabbath, which we do by attending Mass every Sunday. We are body and soul; unlike the angels, who are pure spirit – we have bodies too, and have to bring our bodies to Church if we are actually to worship Him. Our worship of God is embodied in action. Keeping holy the Sabbath also means to rest from all unnecessary work; of course some work is essential for life, within our families and in key services to the community, but for other things that can wait, there are six other days in the week. The purpose of Sabbath rest is to recharge us physically, mentally and emotionally; to spend time and deepen bonds with family and friends, and to relax and reflect on the works of God.

The remaining seven commandments speak of our relationships with others. We are to honour our father and mother, not only when we are young, but also when they grow old. We are to respect all life from God and not cause unjust harm or commit murder. We are to respect the sacredness and permanence of marriage, and not to jeopardise the stability of families through infidelity. We know how much harm adultery does to children and to all involved. We are not to steal, cheat or defraud. By extension, gossiping can be a type of stealing, as it robs a person of their good name and character in the eyes of others. We are not to tell lies; as Jesus says, Satan is the father of lies. We are also not to be jealous or resent the success, or possessions of others – we are all blessed by God in different ways, and should count those blessings, even being able to rejoice in others' success.

These commandments provide a solid foundation for good living and healthy societies. If we wish to call ourselves sons and daughters of God, we must keep these commandments and form our consciences by them. Our consciences must be properly formed in order to be a reliable guide – it is possible for our conscience to be mistaken, especially under the influence of what we read and see on TV, which can pollute. With a mistaken conscience we might make up rules for living that are twisted, and thus end up justifying actions that are objectively speaking, contrary to God's will.

Reflecting on the commandments can disturb us, because this reminds us that God's call to live a fulfilled life is challenging, but ultimately brings peace and happiness. In the light of these commandments, we can examine our consciences, and have recourse to the Sacrament of Reconciliation which brings us a new beginning – a spring clean for the soul.
