## THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD (SOLEMNITY)

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of Jesus. The readings recall His final moments on earth before ascending into heaven. The disciples would have felt sadness and perplexity at His departure – it would be difficult to adjust to life without Him physically present. They would miss His human speech, His way of acting, looking, smiling, and of doing good. After the resurrection He appeared to them many times in His risen body and continued to teach them, in preparation for this moment, when He will physically leave them.

Christ ascended to the Father because His earthly mission was complete. He had redeemed humanity by His cross and resurrection, and established the Church to continue His work; as the Gospel tells us, it must 'go out to the whole world and proclaim the Good News to all creation.' Christ has elevated our human nature. At the fall, when Adam and Eve disobeyed God and death entered the world, they were told, 'you are dust, and to dust you shall return.' But now, the Redeemer, having taken our human nature to Himself, raises that human nature through His total obedience to God. The Ascension, as the culmination of Christ's life and work, finally places human nature where it was created to be, back in union with God.

Jesus has gone before us to heaven, taking our human nature there, and He assures us that where He has gone, we too can follow. But this requires us to act in conjunction with Him – He cannot save us without our cooperation. Even the Apostles thought that Jesus would do everything for them, 'Lord, are you going to restore the Kingdom to Israel?' and when He disappears they stand gazing into the sky. Jesus makes clear that *they* have work to do: when the Holy Spirit comes upon them they will be empowered to be His witnesses and to go out preaching, not only to Israel, but to the ends of the earth. Jesus built His Church on the foundation of Peter and the apostles; because of their preaching and that of their successors through the ages, we have received the faith.

2000 years later, the work continues. We all have our part to play in carrying out His mission. When we remain in union with Him by keeping the commandments, receiving the Sacraments and staying close in prayer, we receive the power from on high that we need to carry out our roles in making the world holy. Because Christ has Himself entered our human experience, He has sanctified it – whatever honest work we do can make us holy, and influence society for good. The Christian is different because He is called to be Christ in the world. That is the tremendous dignity that you and I have.

Today's feast reminds us that Christ united earth with heaven in His own person. He established the Church, His body on earth, but did not abandon it. On the contrary, He sustains and feeds it, through the power of the Holy Spirit, so that all of the members will receive the grace they need to follow where He, the Head has gone.

So today we join our prayers with the company of heaven, in praising God.

All are encouraged to attend.

**FIRST COMMUNION:** Congratulations to the 78 children who received their First Communion over the past two Sundays. The children and their families will also participate in the Procession in honour of Our Lady this Sunday. A Mass of Thanksgiving will be celebrated on the Feast of Corpus Christi, Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> June, at 10am, which all First Communion families are expected to attend.

**PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM:** A reminder to all those who signed up for the pilgrimage to Walsingham next Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May – please be at the Church at 7.30am, as the coach will depart promptly soon after. The journey is long, so we will be unable to wait for latecomers.
