FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (SEA SUNDAY) (B)

Today's readings focus on the theme of being chosen and sent out by God. We are all chosen by God and called to draw others to Him, no matter who we are or what our background is. The first reading speaks of Amos, a family man who worked as a shepherd and farmer. He lived an ordinary life, until he heard the Lord calling him from his work to serve as a prophet to Israel. Amos acknowledges that his own talents and background do not qualify him for this calling, but he follows in obedience to God, trusting in Him.

In the Gospel, Jesus begins to send his disciples out. By now they had been with Him for some time, and had observed Him preaching, casting out evil spirits and healing the sick. He invests them with His authority and sends them out to do the same. But He gives them some specific instructions; they are not to take with them any bread, a haversack or money, nor are they to be concerned about accommodation. This may seem bizarre to us, who are accustomed to preparing well before undertaking a journey – but Jesus wants his apostles to trust in Divine Providence, and not in their own power. Instead of seeking security in money, nice food and comfort, they are to rely on God's grace for all they need. In this way they also give a more credible witness to Him; they show that true happiness and joy does not lie in material things, and so they can be set aside. It is an important lesson for us – very often our homes are cluttered with things we don't really need.

Our worth is not determined by what we own, our status, career, education etc. These things are good, but they do not in themselves define who we are. At a much deeper level we are immensely loved by God, who did not have to create us, but chose to do so. Having chosen to make us, He has a purpose for each of us: we were created to give glory to Him. As St Paul says, 'to be holy and spotless and to live through love in His presence...and to praise Him.'

We may think we have nothing to offer, but no! Each one of us is chosen and sent by Christ to someone. We can all reach people that others can't, and can rejoice in the dignity that Jesus has given us of being able to share in this work of making Him known and loved by others. This won't always be easy – people do reject Christ's message, even as they rejected Him when he preached Himself. If we experience rejection on account of Christ, we should not be downcast; Jesus tells his disciples to shake the dust off their feet. But we should also be prudent; sometimes people reject the Gospel because they are deeply wounded at some level, so it may be better not to simply walk away, but to continue reaching out in love and compassion – that others might be healed and eventually won over by our loving concern.
