## **TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (B)**

Today's readings challenge us to ask ourselves honestly: what do I value the most? What do I seek my security in? In the Gospel, a young man runs up to Jesus, kneels before Him and asks what he needs to do to inherit eternal life. This question is one that, in essence, all of us ask in one form or another; it can also be expressed as 'What is my life really about?' or 'How can I fulfil the deep longing I have for more?' St Augustine said that 'our hearts are restless'; this young man's heart is restless, so he comes to Jesus for an answer.

Jesus takes the man through the commandments that relate to love of neighbour, and the man says he has kept them all. But when Jesus says that the man 'lacks one thing', and must 'go sell everything and give the money to the poor', the man goes away sad. He is so attached to his wealth that he cannot give it up. The great sadness here is that Jesus was calling him to follow Him more closely. The Gospel says that Jesus 'looked steadily at him and loved him,' but the man, so caught up with his possessions, missed that loving gaze and failed to perceive what was really important: the gift of eternal life. This would have fulfilled his deepest desire.

In many ways we can identify with this man. We too would say we are interested in growing closer to God and that we try to keep the commandments. The man in the Gospel had an obstacle; he was fixated on his possessions, afraid of losing them and the security they offered. What are the obstacles that prevent us from following the Lord with our whole heart, mind and soul? What are we holding on to?

Jesus' words cut the man to the core; they get to the heart of the matter. As the second reading says, the Word of God (who is Jesus Himself) cuts like a double-edged sword; it can judge the secret emotions and thoughts. Jesus is the Divine Physician, and with the precision of a surgeon, He can show us what needs to be removed. If we then choose to submit our lives to Him, He will set us free, and the obstacles will not hinder us any more.

Let us pray for the gift of wisdom, that we might know what is really valuable. In the first reading the gift of wisdom is described as more precious than gold, silver and all riches. Many things in life can captivate us, but let us seek the gift of wisdom to know how to spend our time well, what to invest our energies in, what to pursue, and what is ultimately of greatest value.

Let us not, like the rich man, go away sad, but let the Lord's gaze penetrate to our hearts, so that nothing will obstruct His work in us.
