THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The decline in nature at this time of the year reminds us that life is passing, and we know that someday, even the world itself will come to an end. Our readings today speak about the end of time. The prophet Daniel in the first reading describes a time of great distress, and Jesus in the Gospel describes the sun darkening and the moon losing its brightness. These readings should not terrify us, but should remind us that there is nothing permanent in this world – all will pass away. We ourselves are living in between the first coming of Christ, when He came in the flesh, and His second coming, when He will come in glory to judge the living and the dead at the end of time.

When will the end of time be? Many false prophets have made predictions, proclaiming that the end is imminent or attempting to set a date for it. Such people should pay more attention to Jesus in today's Gospel who says that no one knows when the end will be, neither the angels, nor the Son of Man, only the Father. All we know is that when we die, our particular world will come to an end. When that time comes, we will go forward to meet Christ our Lord face-to-face, and so in the meantime we are called to be ready and prepared for this encounter lest it catch us by surprise. We must strive for holiness – to live every moment in friendship with God, aware that one day we shall have to give an account of ourselves.

We will be ready for this encounter if we try to stay close to God through prayer, through love and service of our neighbour, through receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation when we fall, and by coming to Mass.

Today's readings carry both warning and encouragement. We are to be aware of the times in which we live, and of all the things that can lull us into a false sense of security, and cause us to forget why we are really here, and that one day we will meet our Lord again.

Christ defeated sin on the cross, as the second reading tells us, by His great sacrifice. But the battle between good and evil continues, and we are caught up in it. We can choose which side to be on. The devil is very real, and seeks our destruction – and in this battle we must choose the good, and oppose him in every circumstance, as our allegiance is to Christ. The first reading speaks of Michael, the Archangel, whom the Church has always invoked for protection and defence against the forces of evil. Through the graces we receive in the Sacraments, we participate with Christ in overthrowing Satan and the enemies of God.

There is a cosmic struggle between good and evil; we see our world consumed by evil: so much destruction everywhere. It is up to us to fight the battle and to tip the balance in favour of good. We cannot sit on the sidelines: this battle needs all of us.

When we pray the Creed we say, 'He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end.' We pray that we may endure the struggles of our time, so that we may be ready to meet the Lord and enter into His kingdom.
