8th November 2015 THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's first reading and Gospel present stories of two widows. Widows in ancient Israel were very vulnerable; they did not have inheritance rights and usually had to rely on their children, male relatives or charity for survival. They would not have the state support we have, so life would be hard for them. The widow in the first reading is living through a harsh famine and has few resources left to support herself and her son. The Prophet Elijah is sent to her and he asks her for water and bread. The woman has so little; she only has enough for one last meal and then expects to starve, but she is still willing to give from her scant resources – and God blesses her generosity. She is able to prepare food for all of them without running out. In the Gospel, Jesus praises the widow who puts two small coins in the treasury. Like the widow in the first reading, this widow also has so little and yet is willing to give all that she has – and for this Christ commends her.

In these accounts, we see that divine logic overturns human ways of thinking. Our natural instinct when faced with scant resources or destitution would be to hold onto everything we have, to see to it that we ourselves have enough. But the great paradox and a great truth of the spiritual life, is that *abundance comes from the willing gift*. The act of freely giving away to others, especially when this is most difficult for us, bring the greatest blessings. What we share with others could be our wealth, but also our possessions, our time, our faith and our joy. Giving to others in these ways brings great peace and healing to us.

The central point is to forget ourselves. That is why Jesus criticises the scribes so harshly in the Gospel, because they delight in their own honour, they crave esteem and human respect, and even their outward display of piety is a show. In the end, this reflects a deep insecurity. They were learned men, and there is nothing wrong with that, but they lacked humility and were over-concerned with their own position. This can be a danger for us too: whatever gifts we have are wonderful and should be used for God's glory, and not to puff up our own pride and sense of importance. If we are seeking after status, privilege, titles, in order to satisfy our egos – it is a sign of fear and insecurity. These are false supports, which are short-lived.

God's ways are different. The two widows are animated by the love of God. Their actions are not self-serving; there is nothing in it for them. It is only when we know how deeply God loves us that we can trust Him enough to let go and give fully of ourselves. One of the Beatitudes we heard last week was 'blessed are the poor in spirit; theirs is the Kingdom of heaven.' – to be poor in spirit means we are detached from worldly things, recognising that everything is a gift from Him.
