The Ascension of the Lord (C)

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of Jesus. Over the last 6 weeks, we have been contemplating the Lord's resurrection and appearances to His disciples. He taught them many things: he reconciled Peter's denial, resolved Thomas's doubt, and opened all of their minds to realise that the scriptures of old were being fulfilled in His Person. During this time of his appearances, He continually offers them His peace and reconciliation, and their relationship with the Lord reaches a new level of maturity and intimacy. He has been forming them for the mission they will undertake.

In today's Gospel, the Risen Lord leaves the disciples, and ascends to the Father. By the Ascension we do not mean that Jesus is travelling into space like a rocket. Rather, the Ascension means that Jesus passes out of space and time altogether, into a different and higher dimension, into the dimension of God's own life. The disciples will now no longer expect to have him suddenly appear in their midst to converse with them, they will no longer be able to touch him, or eat with him as they did on the lakeside.

Christ ascended to heaven, but his ascent did not bring distance or sadness. On the contrary, the Gospel tells us the disciples were 'continually in the temple, praising God.' Where before they were closed in on themselves, paralysed by fear, now with joy they look up and worship God.' Their horizons were broadened, they could see beyond the limitations of this world, to the eternal. Where Christ had gone, they hoped to follow.

It is the same for our worship. When we come to Mass, we don't celebrate ourselves. The first thing we do is bless ourselves in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Our minds and hearts are raised up to a heavenly dimension. The Mass is a participation **now** in the heavenly life. We invoke the angels and the saints in the Gloria and Holy Holy; at every Mass, heaven and earth are united in praising God. When we receive the Eucharist we receive the Bread of Angels and the Blood of Christ; this is a foretaste of the eternal banquet which one day we hope to enjoy.

Hope is the virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit. We ourselves often do not look beyond the crosses of the present because our hope is weak, and our resurrection and future life is a distant concept. On this feast of the Ascension, we pray for the gift of hope. As St Paul prays in the second reading, 'may he enlighten the eyes of your mind, so that you can see what hope His call holds for you.'

TWO WEEKS TO GO: PROCESSION IN HONOUR OF OUR LADY: The annual Parish May Procession in honour of Our Lady will take place on **Sunday 22nd May**, starting at 2pm at the upper site of Our Lady & St George School. After a blessing and crowing of a statue of Our Lady, we will process along Shernhall Street to the Church, where the rosary will be prayed in a number of languages. The afternoon will conclude with refreshments in the parish hall. Please do come along with your families, and invite others to come too. Processions are an outward expression of our faith, and we come together to honour Our Lady and ask for her maternal intercession.

FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING: The next meeting of the finance committee will take place on Monday 9th May at 8pm in the presbytery. All members are expected to attend.

CONFIRMATION: The next session for the Confirmation programme is this Sunday, 8th May at 4pm in the Parish Hall. Please continue to keep the young people and their families in your prayers.

RCIA (BECOMING A CATHOLIC): The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) group meets on Thursday evenings at 8pm in the Church meeting room. This group is for people interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, and exploring the possibility of entering the Church – or for adults who may have been baptised but never received First Communion or Confirmation. The group meets every Thursday at 8pm in the Church meeting room.

READERS FOR SATURDAY 6PM VIGIL MASS: We are looking for new readers to join the rota for the Saturday 6pm Vigil Mass. It would be necessary to attend a brief training session.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO DOOR OF MERCY, BRENTWOOD: Our Parish will be going to visit the Holy Door at Brentwood Cathedral on Saturday 28th May, and a coach is now booked to depart the parish at 11am. Upon arrival we will go through the Holy Door, then have lunch. After lunch, confessions will be available, Mass will be celebrated at 3pm and we will return to Walthamstow by 5pm. **The list at the back of the Church is now full, but keep an eye on it for cancellations.** We request £8 per seat, collected on the day, which includes a small donation to the Cathedral for use of its facilities. All attending will need to bring a packed lunch. The coach has 53 seats.
