19th June 2016 Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

The readings of the Old Testament are so important to understanding the meaning of the New Testament, especially the actions of Jesus in the Gospels. At Sunday Masses, there is typically a connection between the First Reading and the Gospel. Usually the First Reading throws light on the Gospel.

Today we see again a strong connection between the first reading from the Prophet Zechariah, and the account from Luke. Zechariah's prophecies come about 500 years before Christ, and look forward to a great Messiah, who would unite all the tribes of Israel. The prophecy we read today speaks of a suffering and wounded messiah, 'they will look on the one whom they have pierced.'

In the Gospel today Jesus takes up the question of His identity. He confirms Zechariah's words, saying that 'the Son of Man is destined to suffer grievously and to be rejected.' He will be the glorious Messiah, but through suffering.

Jesus challenges us: if we want to follow Him, we must be prepared to take up our cross. Here the Lord teaches each of us that to give ourselves away in love will always mean suffering. The word 'love' is so misunderstood in our times. To love means to will the good of the other, and not let our own egos get in the way.

Why does love involve suffering? It is because our deepest tendencies are to be selfish: we are affected by original sin, and a wounded human nature. So when we try to love, there is an interior resistance, which tempts us to seek an easier route, for our own comfort and self-preservation.

But Christ teaches us that genuine love costs. Expect the world to resist you when walking the path of Christ.

Today we pray for the courage and the strength to take up our crosses in imitation of the Master, who showed us the meaning of love in being pierced for us, and bearing the weight of our sins.

She will also be available during the course of the weekend to meet privately with anyone wishing to see her. More details will be available in due course, but we encourage as many people as possible to come along, whether directly affected or not; it is an important issue which affects many people, and in this Year of Mercy we are reminded that forgiveness and

healing is possible by the grace of God. Anyone is also very welcome to approach one of the priests, at any time, in complete confidence, if you have any questions or worries.
