Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Today's readings speak of the power of God to transform desperate situations. In the first reading, a widow with whom Elijah is staying is on the verge of losing her son; her only means of support. She blames Elijah, and Elijah pleads to God in desperation for her and for her son. Precisely at this desperate moment, the Lord hears Elijah's prayer and the child revives.

Sometimes, it is only when we experience pain and difficulty that we cry out to God and seek his help. Pain and suffering can shake us out of our complacency; it is when we are at the depths, and brought low, that we most readily cry out for assistance. The author C.S. Lewis wrote that 'God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our consciences but shouts in our pains.' God is there in good times and bad, and we should not forget that; but often we do, and so as Lewis continues, '[Pain] is his megaphone to rouse a deaf world.'

We see this in the Gospel, which is similar to the first reading. In the Gospel, Jesus brings back to life the son of another desperate widow, and this child has already died. Jesus takes pity on her in her distress and raises the man to life. Once again a situation of despair is transformed into hope, and it is only through the initial misery that a miracle can be worked which fills the onlookers with awe and praise of God – thus restoring their faith. They recognise that in Jesus, 'God has visited his people' – but they don't leave it at that. They don't keep this news to themselves; they are compelled to share it, and so this opinion of Jesus 'spread throughout Judea and all over the countryside.'

What about us? We believe in Christ, and we encounter him when we pray and especially in the Sacraments. But even if we receive the Sacraments, do we really believe? Are we really convinced that he alone has the power to transform dark and desperate situations? Are we convinced that in him lies the fulfilment of our deepest human needs? St Paul in the second reading is certainly convinced; he abandons his life as a persecutor of the Church, recognising the Gospel as no ordinary 'human message'. Our Catholic faith is not one philosophy among many, it is the key to human happiness because its founder and centre is Jesus Christ, who came that we may have life, and have it to the full. **Fr Maurice**

UPCOMING PARISH MISSION: As announced last week, there will be a Parish/School Mission from the 11th – 15th July 2016. The mission will be a week of talks and prayer aimed to renew us in faith and to reflect particularly on the gift of God's mercy, during the current Year of Mercy. **At today's 12pm Mass**, a number of people from the mission team will be sent by Bishop Alan to begin visiting all the houses in the parish, knocking on doors, speaking to people, proposing Jesus Christ to them and inviting them to the Church. Jesus' mission was to gather all humanity in; that is why he founded the Church. We should not be inward looking, but should be seeking to share the treasure of faith that we have. It is not only a task for priests or select professionals, but for all of us! The power to bring souls to Christ does not come from ourselves; on our own we can do nothing; but trusting in God and asking the help of the Holy Spirit, we all have a part to play and can do it, with joy! May the light of Christ shine in our hearts and on our faces, so that many will come to believe through us.

FR KEVIN ARRIVES: Fr Kevin Lenehan, a priest of the diocese of Ballarat, Australia, will be visiting the parish, arriving on Tuesday 7th June and staying for much of the month. He will be assisting with Masses and pastoral work while he is with us. We warmly welcome him back.

RUBY JUBILEE: Next Saturday 11th July, Mother Maria Chioma Emeagi, Superior of the Marian Missionary Sisters of the Poor will be celebrating the 40th anniversary of her religious profession (Ruby Jubilee). There will be a Mass for Mother Maria in the Church at 12 noon, celebrated by Bishop Alan, to which all parishioners are welcome.

ST PATRICK'S MISSIONARY SOCIETY APPEAL: Next weekend, Fr John Garry, a priest of St Patrick's Missionary Society will be coming to the parish and speaking at all Masses about the work of the society. Fr John has worked in Kenya and the Sudan. A second collection will be taken to support the work of the society. Please support this cause generously.

AFFECTED BY ABORTION? On the weekend of 2nd/3rd July, Bernadette Goulding from a charity called *Rachel's Vineyard* will be visiting the parish. The major work of *Rachel's Vineyard* is running weekend sessions throughout the UK and internationally, to provide an opportunity for anyone who has struggled with the emotional or spiritual pain of abortion to find healing. Their events offer a supportive, confidential and non-judgmental environment where women and men can deal with painful post-abortive emotions. Those attending can be helped to experience God's love and compassion, reconciliation, forgiveness and peace.

On the 2nd/3rd July, Bernadette, who has personal experience of this issue, and has personally led over 170 retreats in countries including the UK, Scotland, Malta, Faroe Islands, Korea, Lebanon, South Africa and Croatia, will speak briefly at the end of all the Masses, and on the afternoon of the 3rd, will give a short talk followed by time for Q&A. She will also be available during the course of the weekend to meet privately with anyone wishing to see her. More details will be available in due course, but we encourage as many people as possible to come along, whether directly affected or not; it is an important issue which affects many people, and in this Year of Mercy we are reminded that forgiveness and healing is possible by the grace of God. Anyone is also very welcome to approach one of the priests, at any time, in complete confidence, if you have any questions or worries.

RCIA (BECOMING A CATHOLIC): The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) group meets on Thursday evenings at 8pm in the Church meeting room. This group is for people interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, and exploring the possibility of entering the Church – or for adults who may have been baptised but never received First Communion or Confirmation. The group meets every Thursday at 8pm in the Church meeting room.
