Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

At one time or another we all go through periods of difficulty, crisis or conflict. Bad situations can arise that disturb us and rob us of inner peace. We can find ourselves in a dark place, not knowing where to turn. In some moments we might think that God doesn't care, or even question whether he exists.

In our first reading, the prophet Habakkuk was in a similar place. When faced with the threat of a violent enemy he asks, 'how long Lord must I cry for help, while you will not listen? Outrage and violence is all I see, all is contention and discord flourishes.' Habakkuk witnesses man's capacity for evil and he wonders whether evil will triumph.

It can often happen that we go through periods of desolation when we feel that God is distant or absent. Yesterday we celebrated the feast of St Therese of Lisieux. She devoted her life to God as a contemplative nun, so you might expect she would always feel very close to God. But by the door of her cell in the convent, she had scratched into the wood, 'Jesus is my only love.' She did that at a time of near despair, when she experienced nothing but absence, emptiness and darkness. But she still clung to the assurance of being loved and carried in His arms. That is faith at a heroic level.

In the Gospel, the apostles ask our Lord to increase their faith. Faith is the gift from God that moves us to trust in him, but it is also our free action to seek him and to do his will. Jesus emphasises how precious faith is, because even the slightest amount can do wonders. Think of all the times in the Gospel that Jesus says, 'Go your faith has saved you', or, when 'Seeing their faith...' he works a miracle. Another time he asks, 'when the Son of Man comes again, will he find any faith on earth?' The slightest amount of faith can work wonders because it disposes us to act, and for God to act through us, to accomplish things that seem amazing to us, even impossible. As one of the psalms says, 'trust in the Lord, and he will act.'

MISSION FOLLOW-UP – TRAINING FOR YOUNG PEOPLE: As a follow-on from our successful parish mission in July, Fr Soji's team are in the parish this Sunday to provide training to young people (aged 15-25) to help them feel more confident about their faith and sharing it with others. The day begins with the 10am Mass, followed by tea and coffee and then a meeting in the newly refurbished back rooms of the parish hall.

PARISH ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES: Following the departure of Fr Patrick, over the next two weeks, Fr Maurice will be meeting with representatives from the different committees in the parish, to clarify roles and responsibilities.

CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: The Confirmation programme for next year will begin in January 2017, and planning is currently underway. Young people in school year 10 and above, wishing to be confirmed next June, should come personally to speak to Fr Maurice and collect a form to express interest, and return it by October 23rd. These forms will be available from next weekend. Fr Maurice will then contact you to arrange a meeting, provide more details and give you a full application form.

FAMILY FAST DAY: Next Friday is family fast day. Please take an envelope after Mass and return it with the collection next Sunday.

SIGNING OF SECONDARY SCHOOL FORMS: Fr Maurice will be available for signing secondary school forms in the Church meeting room on the following evenings **only:** 10th October, 6-9pm, 17th October, 6-9pm, 24th October, 6-9pm. For secondary admissions, the closing date for the return of the forms to the school and the Waltham Forest application form to the Borough is 31st October 2016.

RCIA (BECOMING A CATHOLIC): The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is for people interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, and exploring the possibility of entering the Church – or for adults who may have been baptised but never received First Communion or Confirmation. Sessions take place on **Thursday evenings at 8pm in the Church meeting room**. FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2016/17: The programme for the First Communion begins next Saturday 8th October. Children must be dropped off at the parish hall for registration at 9.45am, and parents will thereafter go to the lower site of Our Lady & St George primary school for their session, which begins at 10am. The sessions will run in parallel and conclude at 12pm. The following Sunday, 16th October, the children and parents will all gather for the 10am Mass.

STEWARDS OF THE GOSPEL SURVEY: As you know, Bishop Alan has established a strategic planning group for the diocese. Part of its work is to gather the thoughts and feelings of parish communities on a number of issues that can be fed back to the Bishop and help the parish reflect on its own needs and future. To this end, the Stewards of the Gospel group, led by Conrad Almeida, is conducting the diocesan survey in our parish from next week until the middle of November. There will be many opportunities to view and respond to the questions:

- They will be on display in the Church meeting room from next week, and response can be left in a special box in that room.
- They will be distributed in a special booklet next week, and responses can be dropped into the box in the meeting room.
- Parish groups will be asked to respond to the questions in their regular meetings.
- The older pupils will be surveyed in our schools
- Outreach groups will be formed to contact those who no longer come to Mass on Sunday
