16 October 2016 Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

The readings today speak to us about the importance of persistence in prayer. In the Gospel, Jesus tells a parable in which he praises the persistence of a widow, who repeatedly seeks justice from an unjust judge, and finally her appeals are heard. The woman is determined to obtain justice, and the judge eventually gives in, finding her a nuisance. Jesus teaches all the more that God, who loves us, will hear our prayers and help us, whatever our situations may be. The answer may not come quickly; here is the lesson in perseverance. It is easy to give up praying, and to ask 'what is the use?' In this culture, waiting is not our strong point, because it can make us feel powerless and uncomfortable. When we have to wait, we are not in control.

Perhaps the Lord delays in responding to our prayers in order to purify our motives and our intentions. Jesus tells us not to lose heart if prayer seems to go unanswered. Even in times of crisis, we have to have patience; it is through persistent prayer that our faith will grow. Mother Teresa said that 'prayer is the oil that keeps the lamp of faith burning brightly'. If you are trying to pray, hang in there with it. Whatever the problem or situation may be; stay with it and continue to bring it to prayer.

The best way to learn to pray is by actually doing it. But we all need support. Even Moses in the first reading needed help – he had others to keep his arms lifted up in openness to God. This is why family prayer is so important. Often we tell small children to say their prayers, but we adults have a responsibility to encourage them by our example, to pray with them. The month of October is associated with Mary and with the Rosary. The Rosary can be a challenging prayer to say alone, but sitting together as a family for 10-15 minutes to pray it together can be a great help.

Today we pray for the grace of perseverance and endurance, so we stay in contact with God and do not give up.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE 2016: As next year is the 100th anniversary of the Diocese of Brentwood, in thanksgiving to Our Lady, our parish patroness, we would like to organize a parish pilgrimage. I have made initial enquiries, and expect that we can organize a coach pilgrimage from 22nd-29th July 2017, beginning with a visit to Walsingham, followed by 5 days in Lourdes, and a visit to Paris (including the Miraculous Medal chapel in the Rue de Bac), on the return journey. The annual diocesan Lourdes pilgrimage will be happening at the same time, so we can join with much of their programme. Expected costs, for luxury A/C coach travel, ferry transfer, 3-4* accommodation in Lourdes, guided tours and excursions are about £550 per person. Please let me know if you would be interested in making this pilgrimage, and I will arrange a meeting in the near future. -- Fr Maurice

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2016/17: The next session for the First Communion Programme will be on 5th November. Parents and children will then all gather for the 10am Mass on Sunday 6th November.

CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: The Confirmation programme for next year will begin in January 2017, and planning is currently underway. Young people in school year 10 and above, wishing to be confirmed next June, should come personally to speak to Fr Maurice and collect a form to express interest, and return it by next **Sunday, October 23rd**. These forms will be available from this weekend. Fr Maurice will then contact you to arrange a meeting, provide more details and give you a full application form.

OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY: Next Sunday, October 23rd at 5pm, in the Church meeting room, we will have a screening of 'A Dedicated Man', the story of Fr Patrick Peyton, known as the Rosary Priest. As a seminarian, Fr Peyton was cured of tuberculosis during a novena to Our Lady, and as priest he wanted to tell the families of the world what she would do for them if they would open their hearts and their homes to her by praying the rosary as a family every day. He travelled the world with this message and millions came to hear it (2 million in Sao Paolo, Brazil; 1.5 million in Rio de Janeiro; 500,000 in San Francisco and 2 million in Manila). Fr Peyton's motto was 'the family that prays together, stays together'. Come along and learn about his message of hope. The film is about 30 minutes in length.
