Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

In the Gospel today we see ten lepers who beg Jesus to be cured. All ten are cleansed, but only one, the Samaritan, returns to give thanks. We might wonder how only one could come back to give thanks, when such a great miracle had taken place in their lives.

This shows us the importance of being grateful to God for His mercy. Just as the Lord healed this leper, he offers us healing through the Sacraments, especially in Reconciliation, when we come face-to-face with him and experience his healing touch, through the ministry of the priest. When we receive that sacrament, we leave our sins and burdens behind. The priest usually gives a small penance, a few prayers by which we say 'thank you' to God for having healed us.

The Samaritan in the Gospel teaches us to be grateful. After being cured, he threw himself at Jesus' feet in total thanksgiving and praise. In our lives there are many blessings we enjoy and in order to give thanks for them, we sometimes need to lift our eyes from the gift and look to the Giver.

As you and I go through life, how often do we acknowledge God as the giver? Or are we so absorbed in the gifts themselves that we never look up to Him?

Today we pray that the Lord will keep our souls fresh and alive with gratitude for all his wonderful gifts: for creating us, healing us and sanctifying us.

STEWARDS OF THE GOSPEL SURVEY: As you know, Bishop Alan has established a strategic planning group for the diocese. Part of its work is to gather the thoughts and feelings of parish communities on a number of issues that can be fed back to the Bishop and help the parish reflect on its own needs and future. To this end, the Stewards of the Gospel group, led by Conrad Almeida, is conducting the diocesan survey in our parish from **this weekend** until the middle of November. There will be many opportunities to view and respond to the questions:

- They will be on display in the Church meeting room from this week, and response can be left in a special box in that room.
- They will be distributed in a special booklet this weekend, and responses can be dropped into the box in the meeting room.
- Parish groups will be asked to respond to the questions in their regular meetings.
- The older pupils will be surveyed in our schools.
- Outreach groups will be formed to contact those who no longer come to Mass on Sundays.
- Conrad has a dedicated email address (conrad.sotg@gmail.com) to which answers can be sent.

CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: The Confirmation programme for next year will begin in January 2017, and planning is currently underway. Young people in school year 10 and above, wishing to be confirmed next June, should come personally to speak to Fr Maurice and collect a form to express interest, and return it by **Sunday October 23rd**. These forms will be available from this weekend. Fr Maurice will then contact you to arrange a meeting, provide more details and give you a full application form.

OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY: On **Sunday October 23rd at 5pm**, in the Church meeting room, we will have a screening of 'A Dedicated Man', the story of Fr Patrick Peyton, known as the Rosary Priest. As a seminarian, Fr Peyton was cured of tuberculosis during a novena to Our Lady, and as priest he wanted to tell the families of the world what she would do for them if they would open their hearts and their homes to her by praying the rosary as a family every day. He travelled the world with this message and millions came to hear it (2 million in Sao Paulo, Brazil; 1.5 million in Rio de Janeiro; 500,000 in San Francisco and 2 million in Manila). Fr Peyton's motto was 'the family that prays together, stays together'. Come along and learn about his message of hope. The film is about 30 minutes in length.
