Seventh Sunday of Ordinary Time (A)

In recent weeks we have seen Jesus taking the Commandments and going deeper with them; they are not just a rule of law, but must be lived from the heart and applied in every situation. We see Him teaching with authority; saying 'you have heard it said...but I say to you.' We see the same thing in today's Gospel, where he takes the Law of Moses and teaches us to observe it in a more perfect way. The first reading from Leviticus teaches us not to bear hatred for our brother, not to exact vengeance or to bear a grudge' - and indeed we must not.

But Jesus takes this further, saying we are not only to love our brothers, but are to love our enemies as well. Instead of retaliating with anger and resentment, we are to pray for our persecutors. If anyone imposes upon us, we are to respond with generosity. This is the famous teaching to turn the other cheek. According to Jesus, that is how to be perfect.

By obeying Jesus in his command of loving and praying for our enemies, our souls are gradually moved from malice to charity, from anger to compassion, from confusion to understanding, from self-reliance to dependence upon God, from hatred to love. In short, we become more perfect, more like God himself, more holy. That is what the readings desire for us; the first says, 'be Holy, for I the Lord your God am holy', and as Jesus said in the Gospel, 'be perfect as your Father in heaven is perfect.'

SUMMER 2017 PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO LOURDES: BOOKING INFORMATION: For anyone wishing to join the Parish Lourdes pilgrimage (Saturday 22nd – Friday 28th July 2017), please collect an application form from the presbytery, and return it with a deposit of £150 per place as soon as possible, but no later than **Friday 17th March**. Deposits should be paid by cheque, made payable to 'Our Lady & St George's Catholic Church'. If you have already submitted an application form, a place will be held for you, but please speak to Fr Maurice **as soon as possible**, as there is an updated form that needs to be completed. Please note there are only 49 places in total, and **around half of them are now reserved, so if you have not yet returned your form please do so as soon as possible**. Places are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

CAFOD SPEAKER: This Wednesday 22nd February at 7.30pm in the Church hall, Sr Yvonne Mwalula Mwila will be coming to speak about 'Households in Distress', her project in Zambia to reduce the impact of HIV/AIDS on affected families, by providing quality care and support and livelihood initiatives. Her talk will be followed by a reflection on the refugee crisis and prayer with the Lampedusa cross. Sr Yvonne is making a tour of England and Wales to promote her work, which is supported by CAFOD.
