**Our Lord Jesus Christ The King (A) Solemnity (Youth Day)**

Dear Parishioners,

Chapter 34 in the Book of Ezekiel is about the rulers of the Israel of his day, who do not serve their people. Today we celebrate Christ our shepherd-king. Today's first reading and psalm show us the qualities and characteristics of shepherd who searches, heals, carries, leads and guides.

The shameful treatment of what has become known as the Windrush generation is a modern-day reminder that people are not shepherded with humanity or justice. The Windrush people came from Caribbean countries, Jamaica Trinidad, and Tobago at the invitation of the British government to help to rebuild the country after World War II. The Windrush people were denied legal rights, detained unjustly and deported without due process.

Wrongs are now being righted, but it comes too late for someone who lost their jobs, had been denied health care and suffered emotional trauma. Their stories are heart breaking examples of exclusion by a nation that they helped to rebuild. It is in contrast to the welcome and shelter that a small country like Jordan has given to countless migrants. Jordan shows the world a lesson in inclusion, humanity and compassion.

So what has this to do with shepherding? How is this applicable to the many migrants across our world who are treated by hired hands who run away, rather than by shepherds of faithfulness and compassion? The shepherd calls each sheep by name. God calls us also by name as well as every displaced migrant. The Gospel line of Jesus, *'I was a stranger and you made me welcome'* is a search light into the darkness of abandonment, exclusion and denial of basic human rights that is experienced by countless people today.

In Jesus' day the widowed, the sick, the leper, women and Gentiles were not allowed access to the inner part of the temple as they

were judged unworthy and unclean. In our day, migrants, foreigners on welfare or social care, asylum seekers in Direct Provision Centres are too easily stigmatized as people who should be excluded. The prophet Ezekiel who teaches us about inclusion and acceptance – especially of the lost, the least, the last and the lowest.
