### **FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (B)**

Dear Parishioners,

The slogan 'take the waiting out of wanting' was very popular a few decades ago at the height of economic prosperity. We would all like to have things when we decide we want them. The slogan still governs a great deal of the way that we behave. Waiting seems negative, passive and boring.

Advent is a time of waiting. We remember the time of waiting in the Bible when people were longing for something that would change everything. We read how people longed for an end to slavery, longed to return home, longed to feel close to God, and longed to be spoken to and reconciled. The prophets used the language of imagery and metaphor about the desert blooming, rain falling and a new day dawning after the long night of darkness.

Advent has the same purpose. It calls us to be alert, aware and attentive. Today's second reading from St. Paul alerts us that *God is faithful; by him we were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.*

David Jones (1895 – 1974) an Anglo-Welsh poet wrote poignantly in one of his late poem about his relationship with God: *'it is easy to miss him at the turn of a civilization.'* Advent awareness is trying to develop the attitude that values the gently spoken word, the kind gesture, the presence of forgiveness, so as not to miss God and Jesus at the turn of our changing civilization and not to miss God by mooring the boat of the Church in safe waters, instead of launching out into murky mayhem of people's lives.

Awareness leads to a waiting in joyful hope for *'the master of the house to return unexpectedly'* as the gospel tells us today. Advent alertness is to know that there will always is an unexpected breakthrough of God in our lives. Advent attentiveness alerts us that someone will dispel our darkness and uncover a new light on the landscape of our lives. An Advent attitude gives us *'the resolve to run forth to meet Christ'* (today's collect in the Mass) as *'the loving kindness of God's heart visits us'* with promises of presence and peace.

**MARRIAGES:** By appointment. At least six months' notice is required. Please speak to one of the priests for more information.

**Reopening of the Church:** As the lockdown is ending, from Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December we will have public participatory mass and from the same day there will be no live-streaming of Mass.

### **Guidelines on reopening of the Church**

- Please follow one way system, social distancing and the guidance by the volunteers.
- If you have an illness/feeling unwell, please remain at home until you are fully recovered.
- Entrance only through the front door and exit only through the farther right side door near the sanctuary.
- You will be signed into Mass – Name and Telephone.
- Use Sanitizers, gloves and face coverings/masks.
- Please observe all the signs of social distancing regarding where to sit/kneel in the church.
- Keep social distancing.
- No Altar-servers, readers and deacon for the liturgy.
- Very brief homily.
- There will be no offertory procession of gifts and collection during Holy Mass; instead you may drop your contribution at the basket kept at the entrance and exit as well.
- There is no exchange of the sign of peace.
- After the prayer "*Behold the Lamb of God . . . Lord I am not worthy,*" when the priest holds up the host and says "*The Body of Christ*" the congregation respond "*Amen*". In the same way, when the priest elevates the chalice and says "*The Blood of Christ*" the congregation respond "*Amen*". The communion will be distributed in silence.
- Communicants may receive Holy Communion, in their hands, palms upwards, one on the top of the other, should be extended as flatly as possible.
- No Extra ordinary Lay ministers of Holy Communion.
- Come to receive Holy Communion only under the guidance of the stewards.
- Come early for weekend Masses - church capacity is only 150.
- It is not a known fact on how many people will attend mass. Consequently one way of managing this is for people to come to the weekday masses in the church.
- Offertory collection and donations to be placed in the baskets as you exit after Holy Mass.
- Priests are told to go directly to the sacristy after Mass.

- Please refrain from touching statues.
- No access to the toilets, but only in emergency.
