Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (18/09/2022)

Dear Parishioners,

Decisions are routine. We make them all the time. Will I get up? What will I wear today? What will I have for breakfast? They don't challenge us too much. As adults; mature adults, we are relatively free to make decisions. We are generally in charge of our daily routine. There are some decisions, however that do make a big difference to our world.

Amos is well aware of this in our Old Testament Amos lived at a time when there was a growing tension between those who worked the land for a living and those who were becoming enterprising in the marketplace. The sellers in the marketplace couldn't wait for the harvest because they had made up their minds that they would exploit the poor by raising the price of their goods and by cheating at the scales. Amos is warning them that this is the kind of exploitation that God will never forget. Amos is challenging those who have decided to be unjust, unfair and exploitative in their dealing.

Many of our decisions can affect the poor of the world. Many years ago, in Boston, USA, a bag-lady doll came on the market. Bag-ladies are a common sight on American city streets foraging for a living. The English version has been celebrated in the song 'Streets of London'. ¶Have you seen the old girl who walks the streets of London, dirt in her hair, her clothes in rag¶. As one commentator said at the time, wouldn't it have

been a much better decision by the manufactures to have invested their money in helping the real bag-ladies than indulging in consumerist opportunism. What do you think? Some of our decision have serious consequence for the poorest. We are invited to think clearly and well before making decision that make a huge difference to the poor and needy-where our clothes come from, who are being exploited in the manufacture and production of goods. Is this a fair-trade product and so on. We are invited not to make popular decision but responsible decision. Amen.
