## **Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (25/09/2022)**

Dear Parishioners,

Another challenging Gospel about how we see and treat the poor. Wealth is not the problem. The problem is how we use our riches. Amos is the champion of the poor and oppressed. He says there will be a day of reckoning for those who misappropriated their wealth. This is the story of the rich man in today's Gospel. He showed no concern for the poor and suffering.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church gives us a clear teaching about who the poor among us may be. 'Any one experiencing human misery-for example: those suffering material deprivation, unjust oppression, physical and psychological illness and death, are the poor.' Migrants and refugees can easily be considered the poor among us. Today we consider their plight and how we are responding to their needs. As Pope Francis says 'when we take care of migrants and refugees we also show concern for ourselves, for everyone; in taking care of them, we all grow. We voice our Christian calling to love our neighbour.'

The Gospel message is clear and unambiguous. Wealth, if we have it, can serve God's purpose in so many ways. We can help our migrant brothers and sisters. This wealth may not just be monetary, it may also be our gifts and talents, our faith, our wisdom and knowledge and our pool of resources. It may be a word of kindness or a good deed. The Gospel

alerts us to be aware of those in our midst who are in great need and to lift people out of their impoverished moment; out of their misery.

We don't want to be like the rich young man regretting everything when it is too late. As Oscar Romero said, 'It is not God's will for someone to have everything and others to have mothing'. Amen.
