
Dear Parishioners,

Exhorting the disciples to be his witnesses, the Risen Lord announces where they are sent: 'To Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth' (Acts1:8). The first Christians, in fact, were persecuted in Jerusalem and therefore dispersed in Judea and Samaria and bore witness to Christ everywhere (cf. Acts 8:1,4). Something similar stills happens in our time. Due to religious persecution and situations of war and violence, many Christians are forced to flee their land to other countries. We are grateful to these brothers and sisters who do not close themselves in suffering but bear witness to Christ and the love of God in the countries that welcome them. In fact, we increasingly experience how the presence of the faithful of various nationalities enriches the face of parishes and make them more universal, more Catholic. Consequently, the pastoral care of migrants is a missionary activity not to be overlooked, which can also help the local faithful to rediscover the joy of the Christian faith they have received.

The indication 'to the ends of the earth' must question the disciples of Jesus of every age and must always push them to go beyond the usual places to bear witness to him. Despite all the facilities due to the progress of modernity, there are still geographical areas where the missionaries who are witness of Christ with the Good News of his love have not yet arrived. On the other hand, there will be no human reality

alien to the attention of Christ's disciples in their mission. The Church of Christ was, is and will always be 'going forth' towards the new geographical, social and existential horizon, towards the places and human situations 'on the border', to bear witness to Christ and his love to all men and women for every people, culture and social state. In this sense, the mission will always also be *mission and gentes*, as the Second Vatican Council taught us, because the Church will always have to go further, beyond her own borders, to witness to Christ's love to all.
