First Sunday of Advent (27/11/2022)

Dear Parishioners,


Throughout the scriptures it appears that significant events occur on mountains, be it the giving of the Commandments to Moses or the Transfiguration of Jesus. Indeed in ancient times mountains were considered to be one of those 'thin' places where one could almost reach out and touch heaven. It is fitting then in the first reading that Isaiah has a vision of the mountain of the lord, towering over other mountains and to which there streams all the peoples, called to live in peace and righteousness.

A second key image in today's reading is that of light and dark, and this especially evocative to those of us living in the Northern hemisphere as we come to the darkest and bleakest time of the year. Our lighting of the Advent candles each week reminds us of the one who will come as a light for the world and a light in our darkness.

A third key theme is of being awake, being ready, being prepared. This points to the second coming of Christ at the end of time, of which occasion we do not know the day or the hour. Neither do we know who will be taken, who will be left.

As another season of Advent begins, let us all reflect on how we can live decently, as Paul tells the Romans; to live in peace with one another, as Isaiah admonishes us; and to be awake and ready and prepared for when the Master arrives. Let us also try to take heart when Master arrives. Let us also try to take heart when we find ourselves in places of darkness in our lives, for as we shall hear on Christmas Day from a later passage of Isaiah, 'The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light.'
