
### Third Sunday of Lent (12/03/2023)

Dear Parishioners,

The word of God is written on two levels: the spiritual and the human, the spiritual sense, and the literal sense. The listener must search for the spiritual- deeper meaning of a scripture passage. Basic questions to ask: When was it written? Who wrote it? For whom did he write it? Why did he write it? What was the culture and historical situation? What is the deeper, spiritual meaning of today's Gospel? The Jews and Samaritans were archenemies. The lews treated them as an inferior race. Women did not count in that culture. A woman could not speak to a man in public. Much like today in some countries. John wrote today's Gospel about 60 years after Jesus. He, more than the other three, is very, very deep. He writes in symbolic language. Instead of miracles, he talks about symbols. A symbol contains what it symbolizes. So, the homilist must dig deep! Jesus was a radical teacher. He ruthlessly demolished Jewish customs, laws, and traditions that were at odds with his teaching. Tired and thirsty he sits by a well. A Samaritan woman shows up alone with her bucket. This tells us something about her because women in that culture came in groups to the well. She must have been shunned by

her neighbours perhaps for her lifestyle. Jesus initiated the conversation and risks the anger of the Jews. Loved, accepted, respected, and appreciated for who she is, for the first time, she has a conversion experience. She did nothing to earn or merit Jesus' unconditional love. Nor can we. No condemnation for her lifestyle and no penance! Forgiveness is pure gift. Changed from sinner to missionary, she runs, without the bucket, to share her joy and new life. No teaching. No preaching. She simply relates her encounter with Jesus. The hostile Samaritans believed her and hastened to Jesus. 'Being a Christian' writes Pope Benedict, 'is not the result of an ethical choice, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.'
