Sixth Sunday of Easter (14/05/2023)

A priest-colleague received a copy of Fintan O'Toole's 2021 book, for Christmas (called We Don't know Ourselves, O'Toole's personal history if Ireland since 1958). It was as If the donor felt my colleague wasn't depressed enough. And still he dutifully read it through, confident there was a message there for him. But he found it hard going, since through all the darkest moments in the Church in Ireland were covered, none of the bright moments were. It was as if the Church only ever brought bad news and left bad effects in its wake.

This pinning of all the misfortunes of Ireland on the Church's shoulder sometimes seems to permeate our lives now. Earlier this year RTE News reported on a tragic fire in an orphanage in Cavan, 80 years previously. One person interviewed, explaining why her relative had been in the orphanage, said it was because of 'the Catholic Church and all that'- as if the 'Catholic Church' was a byword for all that was wrong.


We all know there have been dark moments, we have lived through them, but we also know it is not the full story. The darkness has to be acknowledged before we share the light in the second reading, which Paul challenges us to do, in a powerful way.

'Always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have'.

And despite all, we still have good news to share. For believers and non-believers alike still have questions deserving of reply, deep questions about life and what follows it. Whether people believe or not, there is sickness to contend with, difficult diagnoses, the prospect of death and loss. For believers and non-believers alike, young people are a cause of worry to parents, who anxiously consider their prospects in life, their college admission, their personal difficulties.

And we still have good news to share. But Paul's admonition means we cannot lash out at those who offend us. The answers we suggest can only be given 'with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience'. That's today's challenge.
