Pentecost Sunday(28/05/2023)

Once upon a time, a parish priest was described as having a role akin to the conductor of an orchestra. He wasn't required to have all the gifts and talents of the parish himself, but had to encourage others to use their gifts to produce beautiful music for the whole community.

This made perfect sense in those days when every parish had a parish priest of its own, before the time of clustering, pastoral areas, families of parishes, etc, Now the pastoral landscape has changed. Many priests share responsibility for ever-larger units, while lay leadership develops in parishes. The Church which originally gave form to parishes can't so easily let them go. Even if parishes haven't resident priests any longer, they still need a focus of unity- a strong local leader, a resident deacon or pastoral assistant, or a small group of people who guide the ship.

Whoever takes on the leadership role in the future, he, she or they will find their charter of action in the second reading for Pentecost Sunday.


Here St, Paul reminds us of home truths for parish life. Every community has a variety of gifts available to it, as diverse as the range of people who are part of it. No one person or small group has all the gifts needed to steer a parish or

lead a community. There are indeed all sorts of service to be done, but the same Spirit inspires all, leads all, guides all.

Paul insists that this arrangement mimics a human body, with many parts operating each in a different way, to achieve one purpose. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, say Paul, reminding everyone of the primary sacrament of parish life, the gate through which all have entered their Christian faith, cleric and lay alike.

The gift of all have to be organised, channelled, directed, coordinated, so even if priests no longer exercise a leadership role locally, the Spirit will find one or two to do it- like the conductor of the orchestra, drawing all into harmony and beauty, united in the one Spirit.
