PENTECOST SUNDAY

The readings of today's Mass focus our attention on the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel, Jesus breathes on his disciples and says 'receive the Holy Spirit', giving them the power to forgive sins. The first reading describes the events of the first Pentecost, when there was a great outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. They were filled with power, and were totally transformed from being fearful to becoming courageous. Pentecost is described as the birthday of the Church, because it was the day when the Church began its mission of preaching the Gospel to all nations. This is represented by the many nations and languages described in the first reading – a sign of the Church's universality. Over the centuries the Church has grown, and it is the power of the Holy Spirit which gives it life, which sustains it in persecution, works through its saints, and protects its teaching.

The Holy Spirit is powerful. Look at Peter, how confused and weak he was in the Gospels; yet in the Acts of the Apostles he is changed – he is a new man, a real rock for the first time. His first sermon after receiving the Holy Spirit on Pentecost converts 3000 people.

The same Spirit that came upon Peter and Apostles at Pentecost is given to each one of us in Baptism and Confirmation. The Holy Spirit gives each of us the strength and power to live, spread and defend the faith by word and deed. How active is the Holy Spirit in your life, and in mine?

If we have been baptised and confirmed, we should be living a life full of the Holy Spirit. But we have to be plugged in to this power and switched on. Just like a kettle will not boil or a mobile will not charge unless plugged in and switched on, we will not have the power of God running through us unless we are connected to it. We stay connected through prayer and through the Sacraments – especially the Mass. The Holy Spirit gives us great power, not the kind of power that dominates or controls other people, but the power to determine what is good and right – to make good choices, to think, 'what would Christ want me to do in this situation?' – and have the courage to do it.

We will know whether we are living in the power of the Holy Spirit by the fruits borne in our lives. If we exhibit love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, chastity and self-control, that is evidence that the Spirit is at work in us. However, if our words and actions are causing division because of a lack of charity and truth, the evil one is at work.

The Holy Spirit moves us out of ourselves, away from selfishness and our own ego. We should always seek to recognise the gifts of the Spirit in other people – as St Paul mentions to the Corinthians, 'there are a variety of gifts, but always the same Spirit working in all sorts of different ways in different people.' We must avoid spiritual jealously and envy, or being sad at the gifts of other people. The same Holy Spirit working for good in us is also active in the neighbour. We should not lock the doors of our hearts, or be frozen in self-centeredness, but cooperate with the Spirit. The words of today's sequence are helpful, as we pray for a new outpouring of God's Spirit on us, 'heal our wounds, our strength renew. On our dryness, pour thy dew. Wash the stains of guilt away. Bend the stubborn heart and will, melt the frozen, warm the chill. Guide the steps that go astray.'

On this Pentecost day, we pray 'Come, Holy Spirit, fall afresh on us.'
