## **THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (B)**

One of the greatest gifts we possess is our mind. Our minds are what make us human and more rational than the lower animals. Our minds assist us in making choices and guide our actions. That is why it is very important that our minds are filled with good things. Naturally, our minds are like sponges, absorbing whatever we expose them to. This means that what we fill our minds with affects our behaviour. The idea of doing all we can to preserve a clean and healthy mind is a frequent teaching of the scriptures. St Paul says, 'fill your minds with everything that is true, honourable, pure, lovely, gracious; then the God of peace will be with you.' He also says to the Philippians, 'in your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus', and our Lord Himself says we must love God with our 'whole heart, soul, mind, and strength.'

There are many snares in this world that attempt to get at our minds. Much of what is available on the TV or Internet does not help us to have the same mind as Jesus. Our minds being like sponges can soak up dirt like a sponge. The good news is that we can wash a sponge, and we can also wash and cleanse our minds. This desire to cleanse our minds and keep them clean is also known as repentance, which is the major theme of today's readings.

Repentance means to acknowledge our sins and turn away from them, towards God. In the first reading the Prophet Jonah preaches a message of repentance in Nineveh, a very big city. He warns them of retribution from God if they do not repent, and the people take heed of his warning and renounce their evil behaviour. They repented out of fear of punishment. It is also possible for us to renounce our own evil behaviour when reflecting on the justice of God, knowing that He will judge us. But a better and more perfect form of contrition comes when we are genuinely sorry that we have offended one who has loved us so much. Knowing that God loves us to the extent of coming down and giving His life for us, we are moved to amend our lives, and resolve to abandon our selfish ways.

Repentance is an act of the will; it is something we must decide to do. But we need God's grace to act upon it. The Sacrament of Reconciliation, in which we confess our sins to a priest and receive God's forgiveness, will help us to grow in holiness, and will deepen our relationship with God, especially if we make use of it quite regularly. This sacrament helps to keep us on the right track, and makes us more eager to remain close to the Lord and avoid what is evil in the future.

Life is short and we do not know when it will come to an end for us. We can sense the urgency of repentance in the second reading, 'Brothers, our time is growing short.' Paul is not advocating indifference to our families, but we should view this life from the perspective of eternity. Therefore, where is the pattern of my life leading me? Are my actions directed to the glory of God, or to the passing things of this world and my own ego? If the latter, then repentance is necessary for us. Jesus says the same in the Gospel, 'the Kingdom of heaven is at hand: repent and believe in the Good News'. Like the disciples in the Gospel, when we leave old ways behind and make up our minds to follow Him, we can attract others to Him. People will see the change in us and will desire for themselves that same change, which brings a peace of soul that the world cannot give.
