TWELFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME (B)

Today's readings speak of the importance of faith in the midst of difficulties. Job in the first reading has undergone tremendous suffering, losing his family, his health and his wealth. He had been trying to live an upright life, and so wonders why God has permitted him to suffer. He feels as if God has abandoned him. Job's faith is in crisis, but then God responds, asserting that He has power over creation, and that He can calm storms. This calms the anxiety within Job, and in a later passage he proclaims, 'The Lord gives, the Lord takes away, blessed be the name of the Lord'. Job recognises that despite God's apparent absence in the difficulties of life, He remains in control, and his faith is strengthened.

Faced with the storm on the Sea of Galilee, the disciples in the Gospel felt puny and very afraid. They were experienced fishermen, and they knew that sea very well, but this storm terrified them. Suddenly in the face of danger their own limitations and vulnerability hit home. In desperation they, like Job, thought they had been abandoned. But as with Job, the Lord is there all along; in this Gospel passage He is in the boat with them, but asleep. They wake him in a panic, crying out to Him, 'Master do you not care, we are going down?' Jesus rebukes the storm, again showing the power of God over creation, and His ability to bring them peace on the other side of the storm.

In this Gospel account, the boat is seen as an image of the Church. Christ is within it, but the vessel is tossed about by many rough winds and waves. Through the ages, the Church has had to endure many storms, originating from within and without, where often it has seemed that the Lord is absent. It will continue to be hammered by pernicious philosophies and false doctrines, which will have harmful effects for future generations. But precisely at this time, the Church - all of us - need to summon greater confidence and faith in the Lord, and to pray for the grace of perseverance.

When things are going well, it can be easy to say we have faith. But it is the difficulties of life which really call upon faith. This applies also in our everyday lives. We might find ourselves in a sudden tragedy, or we might hit rock bottom with an illness like depression or an addiction. In all cases we find ourselves confronted and threatened by dark forces that we cannot control. When this happens, it is natural to be frightened. But Jesus says to the disciples, and He says to us, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' Let us have the humility to recognise that we are not self-sufficient. Many storms threaten us, but we do not need to be afraid. Our Lord has authority over all things, and we should not even fear death itself. He has the power and the authority to save and redeem even those situations, which, to us seem hopeless.

Lord, I believe, help my unbelief!
