13th December 2015 THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT (C)

Today we celebrate *Gaudete Sunday*, the third Sunday of Advent. The word 'Gaudete' means 'rejoice'. Christmas is around the corner, which is a cause for joy; yet there are times we don't feel like rejoicing, or we may feel we have nothing to rejoice about.

Yet, today's first and second readings call for joy in the midst of circumstances that would not suggest it. The prophet Zephaniah in the first reading writes to a people whose country has been invaded and devastated, telling them to shout for joy, be glad and exult. St Paul in the second reading, writing from prison, tells the Philippians to rejoice, and not to worry. In both cases people are being told to be glad even if they feel down in the dumps.

It seems the people in these situations are being told to change their emotions at once. But emotions are not chosen, they just happen. We cannot directly force our emotions to change and make ourselves feel glad if we are not; that would not be genuine. But we all prefer joy to grief, happiness to misery; so how can we change the way we feel?

The answer is that to change our emotions we must first change our attitudes. Our attitudes influence and guide our actions; so the right attitudes will lead to right actions, and joy is a consequence. If, for example, we have a resentful attitude towards others, we will act towards them in a certain way; if our attitude is fundamentally one of forgiveness we will act differently. In today's Gospel, John the Baptist gives his listeners, and us, practical suggestions for changing our attitudes. We are to share with those in need, not to cheat or intimidate others, and are to do our daily work honestly. It is in our ordinary encounters, at work, school and home that our attitudes come into play.

If our lives lack joy, we should look outwards, beyond ourselves, to the needs of others. We experience joy when we bring joy to them, not when we are closed up in ourselves. The people in the Gospel were so moved by John's preaching on the coming Redeemer, that they wanted to prepare themselves, so as not to be chaff, but wheat. There is much chaff in each of us, which we need to be rid of in order to experience joy. If we are mentally lazy, weak of will, attached to sin or individualistic, we should not be surprised if we do not experience joy. For some people, being unhappy can be a deep-seated habit, perhaps fuelled by self-pity. How can we therefore shift towards joy?

The shift will come through charity, from the Latin word *caritas*, meaning 'love'. Love is willing the good of the other. If we will the good of others and choose to act accordingly, the fruit of this will be joy. And the bringing of joy to others is what Christmas is about. What we are preparing for is the choice that God made: instead of punishing, He forgives; instead of rejecting us, He became one of us. Christ gives us joy by giving us Himself, and if we live in Him, that will direct our attitudes and actions. We will then experience joy and radiate it.

During this time he will be assisting with parish groups. Paschal previously worked as a lay youth chaplain in Holy Family School, and we look forward to having him with us again. Please keep him and our diocesan seminarians in your prayers as they continue their studies for the priesthood.

SCHOOL BREAK: This Friday our schools break up for the Christmas holidays. We wish our students and staff a restful and happy Christmas.

WALK WITH ME ADVENT BOOKLETS ON SALE: The Walk With Me booklets are a good way to prepare spiritually for Christmas, and are still available in the repository priced, now at a clearance price of 50p.

ADVENT RECONCILIATION SERVICE: The Parish Reconciliation service will take place on Monday 21st December at 7.30pm in the Church. A number of visiting priests will be available for individual confessions, including in Polish, Malayalam and Spanish. Receiving the Sacrament of Penance is a wonderful way to prepare for the birth of Christ.

CHRISTMAS MASS & RECONCILIATION TIMES: A card detailing the times of Masses and opportunities for reconciliation over the Christmas period is available from this weekend. You are encouraged to share these with family members or friends living locally who may have lost contact with the Church.

NEW CHURCH CARPETS: After consultation with the parish maintenance committee and the Church cleaning team, it has been decided that the carpet in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, and in the center aisle of the Church will be replaced before Christmas, as the current carpets are quite badly stained and damaged in places. The full cost of the work will be approximately £2800. Any donations towards this cost will be gratefully received.

PARISH CAROL SERVICE: The parish Christmas Carol service will take place next Sunday 20th December at 6pm in the Church, followed by mulled wine and mince pies. An appeal will be made and a collection taken up for the Brentwood Children's Society.

RCIA (BECOMING A CATHOLIC): The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) group meets on Thursday evenings at 8pm in the Church meeting room. This group is for people interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, and exploring the possibility of entering the Church — or for adults who may have been baptised but never received First Communion or Confirmation.
