Sunday 7th February 2016 **Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time (C)**

Today's readings show us what happens when God unexpectedly breaks into people's lives. He shakes the foundations, and life is never the same again. While praying in the temple, Isaiah has an overwhelming vision of the holiness of God. This vision cuts him to the heart, because he sees clearly his own sinfulness, and that of the people. St Paul in the Second Reading reminds the Corinthians of what Christ has done for them; he died for their sins and rose from the dead. Like Isaiah, St Paul was cut to the heart when he met the risen Christ on the road to Damascus. Paul reflects on this invasion of grace, and sees himself as the 'least of the apostles' because he used to persecute the church. Again, in the light of God, he sees clearly his own sinfulness. Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus steps into Peter's boat without permission, and starts to give orders. Peter obeys the command to put out the nets, even though as a professional fisherman, he has caught nothing all night. And when Peter obeys, they are all astounded by the size of the catch. Suddenly Peter recognises who it is that has worked this miracle, and, falling to his knees he says, 'Leave me Lord, I am a sinful man.'

In these accounts, Isaiah, Paul and Peter have one thing in common. When faced with the light of God's goodness, they clearly see their own sinfulness. This is the experience of all the saints; the closer they get to God, the more they see their inadequacies. The bright light of the sun shows up the dirt on the windows. This is surely the experience of all of us too, as we strive for holiness.

Seeing our own sinfulness should not depress us, but should shake us and bring us to repentance. As the Lord burst into the lives of Isaiah, Paul and Peter, he invades our lives in the hope that we will change and cooperate with his grace. Isaiah was able to go out as a messenger for God, saying 'Here I am, send me!' Paul, once a persecutor of the Church, was able to go out and preach the Gospel with great conviction. Peter was able to leave everything and become a fisher of men.

Isaiah, Paul and Peter all have an encounter with God, which moves their hearts to repentance, and lead them to forget themselves and follow the Lord. We might ask: in what way can we encounter the Lord? Jesus gave us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist as His way of remaining with us, and sustaining us.

I have just returned from the Philippines where I attended the 51st Eucharistic Congress, a large international gathering, which takes place every four years in a different country, to commemorate and celebrate the great gift of the Eucharist. Over 1 million people took part, and at one Mass, 5000 children received first communion. I remembered and prayed for you all when I was there.

Coming to Mass, to be in the presence of the Lord, to encounter Him, and to receive Him into our souls, should be the highlight of our week. As with Isaiah, Paul and Peter, the Lord really has the power to transform us. His grace breaks into our lives, convicts us of our sins, offers forgiveness for them, and gives us a mission.

None of us is a Catholic only for ourselves. Our faith must be shared, and lived. We all have the ability to reach people that others cannot; in our own circles at work, family, friends etc. The Eucharist provides us with the nourishment and the energy that we need in order to carry out the mission that God has for us.

ASH WEDNESDAY: This coming Wednesday 10th February is Ash Wednesday, the start of Lent. **Masses on this day will be at 7am, 9.15am and 7.30pm.** The Church emphasizes the penitential nature of Ash Wednesday by requiring us to fast and abstain from meat on this day. Catholics over the age of 18 and under the age of 60 are required to fast, which means eating only one complete meal and two smaller ones during the day, with no food in between. Catholics who are over the age of 14 are required to refrain from eating any meat. The fast does not apply to the sick, pregnant or nursing mothers.

LENTEN 'WALK WITH ME' BOOKLETS: *Walk with Me* is a prayer and scripture journey for Lent and Easter. The booklets contain a brief reflection, either on the scripture readings of the day or on a catechetical theme. The beauty about *Walk with Me* is the size of the booklet (it's an ideal fit for a pocket or handbag), and is written in a simple and accessible style. 7AM WEEKDAY MASSES: The weekday 7am Mass resumes from Monday 8th February.

RCIA (BECOMING A CATHOLIC): The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) group meets on Thursday evenings at 8pm in the Church meeting room. This group is for people interested in learning more about the Catholic faith, and exploring the possibility of entering the Church – or for adults who may have been baptised but never received First Communion or Confirmation.
