Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

If we are going to undertake a project, it is sensible to plan it properly before we begin. Jesus in the Gospel today gives the example of someone building a tower; they make sure in advance that they have the resources needed to complete it. Good planning helps ensure that our plans come to fruition. Jesus is describing the importance of prudence.

The simplest definition of prudence is 'sound decision making'. Prudence means having the wisdom to foresee what might come of various actions so that we can choose the one that will be the most effective or do the most good. St Thomas Aquinas speaks about three steps involved with prudent decision-making. Firstly, a prudent person gathers as much information as needed, also taking into account relevant moral questions, to help them properly assess the situation. Second, they consider different possible ways to proceed and make judgements about which would be the best. Third, they make the decision to act upon the prudent judgement.

All of this, in some way, is practical common sense. But prudence is also a supernatural virtue, which enables us to see the bigger picture for our lives. As today's psalm reminds us, our lives are short, and the decisions we make also have an eternal consequence for us. For that reason we know we need to order our lives towards God and seek to do what He wants of us. But how can we know God's will?

Jesus has told us that the will of God is for us to love Him and to love our neighbour with a sacrificial love, in imitation of Him. Our decisions are thus guided by God's standards, enlightened by the Gospel and strengthened by the grace of the Sacraments. God's grace will show us what is best, help us to make the right judgement, and spur us on to taking the correct action. It is not easy though, because as the first reading says, our 'perishable bodies' and 'teeming' minds afflict us when we try to pray and seek God's will, and our fast-paced culture does not lend itself to meditation and contemplation on life. We therefore need the wisdom of the Holy Spirit from on high to help us.

Sometimes the correct action will lead us to conflict, as Jesus expresses in those difficult words at the beginning of the Gospel, which speak of hating one's family as a requirement for the disciple. In saying this Jesus does not mean that we must actually hate our families, rather that our love must be correctly ordered: love of God comes first, then of family, and then others. Sometimes the prudent course of action will not be convenient for us, in fact, it can cost us, that is why Jesus says 'anyone who does not carry his cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.' But carrying the cross is the prudent thing to do, because through the cross comes resurrection and eternal life.
