Today's readings speak to us about the right use of the goods of this world. The steward in the Gospel, who is about to be dismissed from work because of his misconduct, quickly calls together his master's debtors and reduces their debts, so that they will repay the favour when he falls on hard times. Although the practice is a bit dodgy, the landowner commends the steward for his astuteness; for taking decisive action to improve his situation.

Commenting on this parable, Jesus says that 'the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light'. Many people are expert at navigating complex business and economic environments and can make good and shrewd decisions, calculated to bring big gains. If you have these kinds of skills, thank God for them because they motivate achievement and excellence. However, there is a danger that the pursuit of profit and power can occupy the primary place that God should have in our lives. Economists and businesspeople look to the future and make appropriate provisions. Jesus is eager that we be just as concerned for the eternal life; that we also look to the future and make appropriate provisions for our spiritual life.

Money, after all, is only worth anything in this life. Jesus tells us to use it wisely, for the benefit of others, so that it will profit us for eternity. Jesus says that nobody can serve two masters, God and money, so our financial and economic decisions must also be subservient to God's law.

Today we pray that we may be spiritually sharp – just like a good businessman can make an insightful decision, let us pray for the same insights for our souls, so that we make the right choices now to benefit us for eternity.
