23 October 2016 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C)

Last Sunday Jesus spoke about the need to pray continually and to persist in prayer. This Sunday he speaks about the need to approach prayer with a humble attitude.

In today's Gospel, the Lord gives us two examples, in the persons of the Pharisee and the tax collector. The Pharisee puts himself at the centre of his prayer, praising the good actions he feels he has 'done' for God. The tax collector is very different; he knows he has nothing to boast about. Like the Pharisee, we often forget that goodness is a gift from God, not something we achieve by our own efforts, and we all have sins for which we need to repent. As the first reading says, God is 'no respector of personages': what is pleasing to him is a humble heart. As it says, 'the humble man's prayer pierces the clouds.' The tax collector is a humble man; his prayer is honest and sincere, and he is the one who goes home at rights with God.

Humility is at the root of the Christian life, and of all genuine prayer. It may be wrongly associated with weakness, with putting oneself down, and with poor self-image, but humility is none of these things. Humility is an honest approach to the reality of our lives, which recognises that we are not more important than any other person. When we see the failings of others, the best way to react is to say to ourselves, 'there but for the grace of God go I'; this acknowledges that any virtues we do have are gifts from God. As St Paul says, 'what do you have that you did not receive?'

Today we pray that we might have the humility of heart to cry out, with the tax collector, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner.'

OCTOBER, MONTH OF THE ROSARY: This Sunday, October 23rd at 5pm, in the Church meeting room, we will have a screening of 'A Dedicated Man', the story of Fr Patrick Peyton, known as the Rosary Priest. As a seminarian, Fr Peyton was cured of tuberculosis during a novena to Our Lady, and as priest he wanted to tell the families of the world what she would do for them if they would open their hearts and their homes to her by praying the rosary as a family every day. He travelled the world with this message and millions came to hear it (2 million in Sao Paolo, Brazil; 1.5 million in Rio de Janeiro; 500,000 in San Francisco and 2 million in Manila). Fr Peyton's motto was 'the family that prays together, stays together'. Come along and learn about his message of hope. The film is about 30 minutes in length. Children are also welcome; there will be some light refreshments afterwards.

CONFIRMATION PROGRAMME: The Confirmation programme for next year will begin in January 2017, and planning is currently underway. Young people in school year 10 and above, wishing to be confirmed next June, should come personally to speak to Fr Maurice and collect a form to express interest, and return it by this **Sunday, October 23**rd. These forms will be available from this weekend. Fr Maurice will then contact you to arrange a meeting, provide more details and give you a full application form.

<u>HOLY HOUR FOR VOCATIONS:</u> There will be an extra Holy Hour of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on **Monday 24**th **October**, from **7-8pm** in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. This Hour will be dedicated to prayer for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE 2017: As next year is the 100th anniversary of the Diocese of Brentwood, in thanksgiving to Our Lady we would like to organize a parish pilgrimage. I have made initial enquiries, and expect that we can organize a coach pilgrimage to Lourdes in July 2017.
