**TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (A)**

In today's Gospel, it seems unfair that the latecomers to the Vineyard were paid the same as those who had been working all day. We can picture the scene and imagine the workers grumbling and complaining. The men who came last had done only one hour's work, and they were paid the same as those who had been there since early morning. Of course, the parable was not intended as a model for employment contracts – it deals with something far more important. So what is the point Jesus is making?

God represents the landowner, who, throughout the day is calling people into his vineyard. In the same way, he comes into the marketplace of our lives, calling each one of us for a purpose. As Blessed John Henry Newman put it, 'God has created me to do Him some definite service. He has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another.' Christ is all-powerful, and doesn't need us. Yet, he has chosen to do his work through us. Perhaps we might think we are not worthy, or not up to it, but his call is continual.

The landowner in the parable understood human nature so well when he said 'why be envious because I am generous?' Let us give thanks for the call that we have received, and for all the blessings that we enjoy. In humility, let us also give thanks for the gifts that others have received, because as members of the Church, we are all part of the same body, and are invited to share all our gifts for the sake of the Kingdom.
