**(World Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life)**

Dear Parishioners,

'Here I am, send me!' These are words that bring joy to the heart at a time when it can be a challenge to find volunteers whether it is in the parish or candidates to the priesthood and religious life. We see Jesus speaking that same word of God by the Sea of Galilee. Among those hearing the word are Peter and his companions as they clean their nets. For them it's been a 'Bad day at the office'- no fish after night's work. Jesus invites them to try again and behold, they make a mighty catch. Note, Jesus invited them to move out into 'deep water'. Had they been fishing keeping safely too close to the shore?

We get a clear message of perseverance; of taking risks and goodness. We think in the thankfulness of those brave men and women and missionaries who ventured to foreign lands bringing the faith to others. In my forty six years as a priest I've experienced this fact of how people of all nationalities have added to the spread of the Gospel. That same task is ours today at home and abroad.

When we really trust in God and respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit, wonderful things happen. We as individuals and church need to 'launch out into the deep'. So often we cling to the shore; we try to keep safe; very little of adventure and so end up getting nowhere.

As we plan for the Synod of 2023, we have a unique opportunity to put forward ideas for discussion. We need to respond to the signs of the times. What is happening around us, or maybe what is not happening may be more pertinent . There are many examples: half empty churches; priestless parishes; our response to migrants and Climate Change, to mention but a few. Have we the courage to launch out into the deep once again?
